

More to Learn

Here are more useful expressions for asking about the tours. Practice them with a partner.

1. **A:** How much is this historical tour?
B: It costs 120 euros per person. But if you both sign up, I can give it to you for 100 each.
2. **A:** How long does the tour last?
B: Almost the whole day. So don't plan on doing something else.
3. **A:** When does the tour start and finish?
B: We usually depart at eight in the morning and come back around five in the afternoon, depending on the traffic.
4. **A:** What does the tour fee include?
B: It includes the full day of transportation and a Tuscan-style lunch at a nice restaurant in Siena.
5. **A:** Where does the trip start from?
B: The meeting point is our Fun Adventure office on Main Street. But if you both decide to go, I can offer a free pickup from your hotel.
6. **A:** What should we do if we want to sign up?
B: You'll need to pay a 20% deposit and fill out this form for me.
7. **A:** What do we have to bring?
B: Your own water, and of course your passports. We'll have an employee check our guests' passports and collect the rest of the money at the meeting point.
8. **A:** What do you mean by sea safari here on the brochure?
